### GERMAN POLICE TO STUDY AT MICHIGAN STATE.

Twelve top-level municipal police administrators from Germany will begin a four-month pilot course in the administration of justice in a democracy at Michigan State College early in May. The program is subsidized by the United States Department of State.

Vienna, Austria, has appointed 34 policewomen detectives (the first in its history). qualifications: high school education plus two years training in "welfare work".

### JAHANGSE FOLICE OFFICIALS VISIT U.S.

Two high ranking Japanese police officials have just completed a 90-day survey of American police training facilities which took them to New York, Jashington, Michigan, Texas, California, and other areas. Professor Hidenori MAKAHARA of the Tokyo Police College and senior Superintendent Osa m KAIHARA, both of the National Rural Folice, addressed law enforcement classes at theUniversity of southern Jalifornia, and were guests at the graduation dinner of the 10th Delinquency Control InstituteClass. Messrs. Nakahara dnd Kaihara perform their duties in Japan under the general supervision of former Deputy Chiefs Eaton and Marrison of the Los Angeles Police Department.

### THIRD ANNUAL INSTITUTE OF CRIME MD DELINQUENCY

Dr. Robert Lindner (author of STONE MALLS AND MEN, REBEL WITH-OUT A CAUSE, HANDBOOK OF CORRECTIONAL PSYCHOLOGY), noted criminologist and psychopathologist, and forwer professor at Lehigh and Bucknell was the principal speaker at the sessions held on March 29, 30, and 31. ### J. EDGAR HOOVER FOUNDATION

The J. Edgar Hoover Foundation, with Drew Pearson as President and Henry Ford II, Harvey Firestone, David Sarnoff, Joe Louis, Joseph E. Davies, Herbert Bayard Swope and Generoso Pope as directors, has been organized to combat juvenile delinquency. Five million dollars is sought to set up near Seneca, Maryland, a 550-acre juvenile facility with a training school for juvenile officers from all over the country.
