BROOKLYN COLLEGE POLICE PROGRAM:

Brooklyn College (N.Y.) has instituted
a two-year undergraduate police science

program leading to the degree, ASSOCIATE
IN APPLIED SCIENCE. Students are re-
quired to complete 60-semester hours of
work of which approximately 30-35 hours
will be in police-oriented subjects.
Donal E. J. MacNamara has been appointed
POLICE TRAINING CONSULTANT to supervise
the police offerings (in addition to
his New York University programs) and
he has selected William Hanrahan, an at-
torney, formerly F.B.I. resident agent
at Reno, Nevada, and SIDNEY FIRESTONE,
also an attorney and a former member of
the N.Y.C. Police Department, as the
nucleus of the police faculty. Courses
being offered include: INTRODUCTION TO
POLICE SCIENCE, POLICE ADMINISTRATION,
CRIMINAL PSYCHOLOGY, CRIMINAL INVESTIGA-
TION, POLICE RECORDS, POLICE PATROL, DE-
TECTION OF DECEPTION, LAW FOR THE POLICE
OFFICER, etc. A catalogue of these
courses, with brief descriptions of

BUFFALO UNIVERSITY POLICE TRAINING COURSES:

Under the direction of Professor
Charles Webster, College of Law, Univer-
sity of Buffalo (Buffalo, N.Y.) and with
the cooperation of the Sociology Dept. a
new police science curriculum has been
instituted. Policemen from 14 towns and
cities of western New York State are en-
rolled. Courses offered include: CRIMIN-
OLOGY, CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE, POLICE

ADMINISTRATION, EVIDENCE, AND JUVENILE DELINQUENCY. College credit is given and a Certificate in Law Enforcement is awarded to all who complete 12 semester hours. Write Professor Webster for further information. (Approximately 35 students)

LIE DETECTION COURSE AT NEW YORK UNIVERSITY:

The one year course in LIE DETECTION AND CRIMINAL INTERROGATION in the Graduate School of Public Administration, New York University, opened September 25 with 45 students. The class includes 9 lawyers, a police inspector, a police captain; 6 police detectives, 5 Federal agents (Justice, Post Office, Atomic Energy, Internal Revenue, Counter-Intelligence), 2 security directors from private industry, 7 probation and parole officers, a military police colonel, an accountant, 3 private investigators, a university instructor, and several scientific lab men. The course is taught by: D. E. J. MacNamara, Col. Ralph W. Pierce, former President, Leonarde Keeler, Inc., and former Chief of C.I.D., and Dr. Fabian L. Rouke, a protege of Father Walter Summers, S.J., inventor of the Pathometer. Texts in use are: Inbau and Reid LIE DETECTION AND CRIMINAL INTERROGATION and C. D. Lee THE INSTRUMENTAL DETECTION OF DECEPTION.

BRAZILIAN OFFICERS TRAINING IN U.S.:

The Division of the Budget, Execu-

tive Office of the President, has assigned 10 high-ranking Brazilian police officers to N.Y.U. for a five-month intensive police training course. They are taking regular courses at the University, special courses at the N.Y.C. Police Academy, and visiting major police agencies in the Metropolitan area. In January and February they will travel to other cities to visit interesting police and correctional installations and training facilities.
