SAC PROGRAM -- AAAS BERKELEY MEETING

26-31 DECEMBER 1954

The following is the tentative agenda for the SAC program at the AAAS Berkeley meeting. The SAC program is scheduled for Tuesday, 28 December 1954, from 9:00 a.m. until 10:30 p.m.:

I. Theme: Education in Criminology

The personnel of the SAC comprise those engaged in the teaching and supervision of programs in the field of criminology on the college and university level. Since the field is relatively new, it would seem appropriate to have men in the various branches of the field discuss their specialties with the purpose of indicating:

1. Content to be covered
2. How it should be covered
3. Kind of courses it should include (appropriate titles)
4. Status of courses: lower, upper or graduate division
5. Other pertinent information

Each speaker will prepare a copy of his paper so that it may be left with the secretary.

The paper may be more complete than the 30-minute oral presentation.

An attempt will be made to have the proceedings published for distribution to members.

II. Branches of Criminology to be discussed:

1. General Philosophy for Criminology Programs (9 a.m.), O. W. Wilson, Dean, School of Criminology, U.C.
2. Law Enforcement (10 a.m.), Richard Simon, Deputy Chief, Commander, Bureau of Administration, LAPD.

3. Penology (11 a.m.), Austin H. MacCormick, Professor, Sch. of Criminology, U.C.
4. Psychology (2 p.m.), Douglas M. Kelley, M.D., Professor, Sch. of Criminology, U.C.
5. Criminalistics (3 p.m.), Paul L. Kirk, Professor, Sch. of Criminology, U.C.
6. Nomination and election of officers (4 p.m.)

The symposium will start at 9 a.m. Each speaker will have 30 minutes for oral presentation to be followed by 20 minutes of discussion. Recess will be from noon until 2 p.m. At 4 p.m. nomination and election of officers and such business as is required will be brought to the attention of the meeting.

At the dinner meeting, to begin at 7 p.m., the newly elected officers will be installed. Such business as was not transacted at the afternoon session will be completed. The remainder of the evening will be primarily social.
