 Born in Budapest in 1929, he studied at the University of Louvain and the University of Paris. He joined the University of Montreal in 1958 where he introduced the teaching of criminology by creating the Department of Criminology, which served as a model for the training of criminologists across Canada. Founding in 1969 the International Center for Comparative Criminology, he played an important role in the development of comparative research at the international level. Research director or consultant to commissions of inquiry on the penal system (Prévost, Ouimet, Le Dain), he participated in the development of a humanist-inspired criminal policy in Quebec and Canada. He is a consultant to the French and Hungarian governments.

President of the International Society of Criminology, consultant of the United Nations (UN), UNESCO, the Council of Europe, etc., he contributed to the influence of our country in the field of penal sciences and criminological.

Honorary doctorate from the universities of Siena, Budapest, Aix-Marseille and the Pantios University of Athens, he is currently president of the International Association of French-speaking criminologists. Member of the Royal Society of Canada and of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences (1975), Officer of the Order of Canada (1985), he is also Commander of the National Order of Merit of Hungary and of the Republic of Ivory Coast.

He is the author of numerous works translated into half a dozen foreign languages: L'inceste en milieu urbain (1958), Crimes et Villes (1960), Criminologie (1965), Criminologie et politique criminelle (1978), Science and crimes (1986), From anthropology to comparative criminology (1993), Traite de criminologie empirique (1994). Founder of the journal Criminologie (Montreal, 1968). He has been scientific director of the Revue internationale de criminologie et de police technique (Geneva) since 1980.
