KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

We, the undersigned, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a NON-PROFIT CORPORATION pursuant to the general non-profit corporation law of the State of California, and we hereby certify:

First: That the name of said corporation shall be:
AMERICAN SOCIETY OF CRIMINOLOGY

Second: That the purposes for which this corporation is formed are as follows:

- (a) To bring together persons actively engaged or who have been actively engaged in teaching and/or practice in the field of criminology;
- (b) To foster training and research in criminology in institutions of higher learning and in law enforcement and correctional agencies;
- (c) To encourage understanding and cooperation among those engaged in criminology;
- (d) To serve as a clearing house for collection and dissemination of criminological knowledge and skills;
- (e) To promote, foster and conduct research in the field of criminology;
- (f) To promote, foster and conduct instruction in the field of criminology;
- (g) To accumulate, correlate and systematize scientific

knowledge and to print, publish and distribute literature and reports in the field of criminology:

(h) To lease, purchase, hold, have, use, and take possession of and enjoy property, real and personal, necessary for the uses and purposes of the corporation and to sell, lease, deed in trust, or dispose of the same at the pleasure of the corporation and for the uses and purposes for which the corporation is formed; to buy and sell real and personal property and to apply the proceeds of the sale, including any and all income, to the uses and purposes of the corporation; to enter into any and every kind of contract or agreement for the uses and purposes of this corporation;

(i) To do any and all things necessary, suitable or proper in connection with or incidental to the accomplishment of any of the purposes or attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or designated, to promote the interests of the corporation, or to enhance the value of its property; in general to do any and all things and exercise any and all powers which it may now, or hereafter, be lawful for the corporation to do or to exercise under the laws of the State of California now or that may hereafter be applicable to this corporation;

(j) The foregoing shall be constituted as purposes and powers and the enumeration thereof shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the general powers now or hereafter conferred on this non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of California.

Third: The primary purposes for which this corporation is formed are as follows:

To bring together persons actively engaged or who have

been actively engaged in teaching and/or practice in the field of criminology; and to foster training and research in criminology in institutions of higher learning and in law enforcement and correctional agencies to encourage understanding and cooperation among those engaged in criminology and to act as a clearing house for the collection and dissemination of criminological knowledge and skills.

Fourth: This corporation is organized pursuant to the general non-profit corporation law of the State of California.


Fifth: The principal office for the transaction of the business of this corporation is to be located in the County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Sixth: That the number of Directors of this corporation shall be three. That the number of Directors may be changed by amendment to these Articles of Incorporation or by a by-law adopted by the members. That the names and addresses of the persons who are appointed to act as the First Directors of this corporation are as follows:




