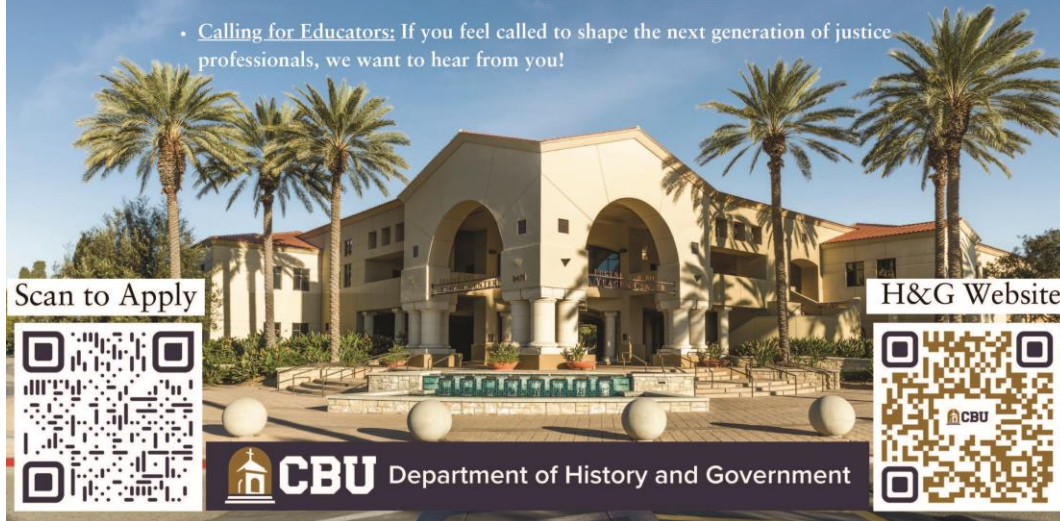


# Criminal Justice Tenure-Track Faculty Position
