The College invites applications for assistant professor positions to begin Fall 2027. The areas of specialization are open. Applicants must have demonstrated effectiveness in research and teaching. Candidates should have a Ph.D. in Criminology and Criminal Justice or a related field (such as sociology, psychology, or public policy). ABD candidates who anticipate degree completion no later than August 2027 will also be considered. A Juris Doctorate alone is not sufficient for consideration. Review of applications will begin on September 28, 2026, and will continue until the positions are filled.
