

Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice Two Instructor Positions

The University of South Carolina invites applications for two full-time, professional-track Instructor position in the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice to begin August 16, 2025. Responsibilities include teaching undergraduate courses, advising undergraduate students, directing undergraduate student research as needed, providing service to the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice at USC-Columbia, and keeping up with new and developing knowledge and issues in the field. The position is a non-tenure track, 9-month appointment with a teaching load of 8 courses for the academic year (4 each major semester). While some instructional assignments may include distance delivery, instructors <u>must</u> be available for on-campus courses in Columbia. Applicants must hold a master's, JD, or Ph.D. degree and have completed at least 18 graduate credit hours in criminology, criminal justice, or a closely related field by the time of appointment. Applicants must be capable of teaching introductory and upper-division undergraduate courses. Commitment to excellence in teaching and fostering student learning is expected, and previous experience as a professional working criminal justice system is a plus. This is an annual appointment that may be renewed, contingent upon satisfactory performance, departmental needs, and the availability of funding. The university provides opportunities for promotion to higher non-tenure track ranks for eligible instructors.
