The Public Policy Center (PPC) in the Office of the Vice President for Research at The University of Iowa seeks an Associate Director of Survey, Evaluation and Methodology Services.

This position will have three core expectations: (1) **survey research expertise and design consulting**, with the person having demonstrated experience and skills in survey methodology, research design modalities, and advanced statistical techniques; (2) **research services and project management**, with the expectation to lead multi-method research services (e.g., telephone, mail, web), which includes setting project objectives and effectively allocating unit resources; and (3) **staff management, strategic planning and communication**, which involves the supervision of professional research staff and the expectations of promoting and planning research services for campus researchers and stakeholders.

The PPC is an interdisciplinary research center that contains the Iowa Social Science Research Center (ISRC), a unit dedicated to providing survey, evaluation, and methodology support. The PPC and ISRC are undergoing a transition to grow, innovate, and better serve the social sciences on campus. The Associate Director of Survey, Evaluation and Methodology Services will have the opportunity to help develop and promote the center's already robust research support services.
