Required qualifications include: a Master's in Sociology or Criminology from an accredited university; evidence of ability to teach research methods (as well as electives within the candidate's areas of strength); and evidence of successful college teaching experience.

Candidates referred for further consideration will be asked to submit the following supporting materials: undergraduate and graduate transcripts (unofficial acceptable) and three references. **Review of applications will begin February 15, 2025, and will continue until the position is filled.**
