In recent years, UNF has transitioned to an R2 institution with an increasing focus on research while maintaining excellence in teaching. Faculty at UNF are on flexible teaching loads, typically teaching between four to six courses per year, with newly hired faculty on a reduced load of two courses per semester for the first three years. Continued reduced teaching loads may be offered to faculty demonstrating significant accomplishments aligned with the university's strategic plan (https://www.unf.edu/strategic-plan/index.html).

UNF is a Carnegie Community Engaged institution. This designation celebrates the University's collaboration with community partners from the local to the global level. They will demonstrate the commitment and capability to provide an excellent learning environment for students, work with student-centered methods of instruction, and contribute to the continuing development and implementation of curricular content.
