Standard teaching load for a Lecturer is 4 courses per semester, but that can be adjusted through the assumption of additional administrative duties.

Experience in the teaching of forensic methodologies and the operations of forensics labs. Evidence of attention to diversity, equity, inclusion, and access in teaching and laboratory operations.
