A demonstrated ability to teach courses both on-campus and online (asynchronous) is desirable. Criminal Justice offers both an on-campus and online major. Additionally, the ability to teach courses involving historically marginalized members of society in relation to criminal justice, as well as develop and teach upper-division courses in the candidate's area of expertise, is desired.

- Previous teaching experience in the "adjudication process, criminal law, criminal court" or "crime scene documentation and forensics," or "juvenile delinquency and juvenile justice".
- Mentoring and/or advising experience at the college or university level.
- Research experience with the potential to establish a successful research program involving undergraduate students.
