The ideal candidate would be expected to teach a variety of traditional and online courses. The successful candidate will be responsible for teaching 4 classes in each of the fall and winter semesters with the possibility of additional teaching opportunities during summers. In addition to teaching, the successful candidate will contribute to departmental-level service needs.
