Due to the school's strong partnership with local and state agencies, faculty have abundant research opportunities.

Responsibilities:

- Teach undergraduate and graduate courses in criminal justice, particularly policing and/or corrections. The standard teaching load for research-active faculty is three classes per semester.
- Develop and maintain an active research agenda that leads to refereed publications.
- Seek external funding for research projects, individually or collaboratively, with faculty or local/state agencies.
- Mentor and advise students.
- Participate in departmental, college, and university service activities.
- Engage with the community and contribute to public scholarship.
